**Objective:** Provide an overview of the basic concepts in psychology to help in better communication and enhance adjustment in life and work

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**Unit 1: Orientation to Psychology:** Nature, fields and applications of psychology; Cognitive Processes: Learning, Characteristics of learning, memory, theories of memory, and problem solving (12 hours)

Unit 3: Social categorization and conflict: In-group vs. out-group; Consequences of social categorization: Cognitive biases & stereotypes, conflict and social categorization. (12 hours)

**Unit 4: Cultural aspects of intergroup relations:** Social identity, Gender Stereotypes, case studies in the Indian context. (12 hours)

**Unit 5: Resolving intergroup conflict:** Intergroup contact; Promoting intergroup cooperation; Conflict management strategies. (12 hours)
